

Much like our proud football program at Berkeley, the keys to Beta Psi's success these past years have been simple: strong recruitment, intelligent leadership, and the persistent drive to become worthy of our past success. In the past two years, our Chapter size has nearly tripled, growing from 13 to 30. Our chapter GPA has jumped from 2.88 to 3.27. However, the cleaners came by only once or twice a week, leaving most clean up to Brothers despite the cost. Starting this semester, the Chapter has once again taken on the traditional responsibility of maintenance, and from the responses of visiting Alumni, you can rest assured things are running quite well.

In addition to simply maintaining the house, the newly initiated Brothers from the Spring 2006

pledge semester contributed additions to the house with their combined efforts on their two pledge projects. A new bar or "lemonade stand" now occupies a corner of the



third floor sundeck and has been a boon for entertaining guests. The second phase of the projects



was the refurbishment of the Chapter Library. All of the shelving received a fresh coat of paint and much needed repairs, and the wood paneling was treated with a

specially formulated mix of gentle oils to help it reclaim its luster. Paired with the resurfacing of the pool table, the room has become quite the popular hang-out for everyone involved. In the past two years, the Chapter has built new furniture for the outside deck and completed a year long-project to increase the size of the parking lot – allowing for more parking during Beta Psi events.
