# Alumni-Sponsored House Improvements

Work was finally completed over the summer, on numerous alumni-financed house improvements. Included was the wiring of all the rooms with two high-speed internet connections along with cable television. Additionally, the third floor deck was renovated. The deck was in serious disrepair, and thanks to the generosity of the alumni, the area of the

deck that heaved was repaired along with the refinishing of the floorboards and benches.

Renovation of the fire stairwell is still yet to be completed, when more funds become available. At the



moment the bare studs are visible from the stairwell, along with the mildew and water damage that has accrued over

the years. Note, too,

that the lack of insulation along that wall has led to increased utility bills to compensate for the lost heat.



Hopefully the wall, which extends from the ground to third floor, will be repaired before the cold winter season arrives.

Work is also underway on the repair of one of the French doors in Chapter Hall. The chapter is

delighted that the composite boards keeping the draft out are finally being replaced by actual doors. The



doors have been waiting over half a year to be repaired. The



work should be complete before the big USC game.

# Member-Initiated House Improvements

During the fourth week of the 2005 Fall Semester work initiated on the sanding and staining of

the third floor sun deck. After the deck was repaired by alumni contributions the live-in members decided to sand and stain/waterproof the deck in anticipation of the October 1st



Homecoming Game against Arizona. Work progressed through the night and subsequent days as



multiple coats were applied to ensure an even stain and waterproofing. Hats off to Kourosh who initiated the project and coordinated the tasks. Special thanks goes out to all the brothers who helped accomplish this project.

Work is currently underway on extending the

lot. parking Since the second week of classes Rich and Scott have coordinated the regular delivery of dirt to the house in order backfill the



trench between the back parking lot and the retaining wall with Westminster House. To date, there have been 40 truckloads amounting to about 60 cubic yards of backfill. The acquisition of this sizeable area will add 5 more parking spots to the lot, which in turn increase revenue from parking on game days. Jake also plans to repaint the parking spots when the extension is finally completed.

Coincidentally, work has started on a new four-player arcade machine. Rich Manzana and Mike Shen have launched this project to replace the old machine. The outer shell for the machine is nearly complete. After the shell is painted the two will install the joysticks, screen, and computer. Everyone looks



forward to sleepless nights of Mortal Combat and other great games.

Finally, the acquisition of a Jacuzzi has prompted serious discussions about the possibility of

extending the Martin deck along with refinishing the floorboards. However, under the tight budget plans for this project may have to be delayed until next year. In order to facilitate this





project a foundation would have to be poured along with additional footings for the

extension of the deck. The proposed project would be the largest member-initiated project in the recent history of the house that would not only expand the usable area of the house, but also add a feature that no other house on campus could boast.

### Homecoming Band & BBQ

Before the Homecoming Game on October 1<sup>st</sup> Sigma Nu Beta Psi held a pre-Game bash that included the Sigma Nu band, *Days in Between*. Food, including




